

## BREAK DOWN A GENEALOGY BRICK WALL – ONE BRICK AT A TIME



Stay cool this summer and solve your genealogy brick wall at the library? If you have spent a lot of time researching on the Internet and you are unable to locate your ancestor, alternative methods can be used. Or, maybe you are interested in finding more details about the person such as what was their occupation or religion.

Usually, many small goals or objectives must be met in order to achieve a more important goal. If you want to find someone in a census record online, for example, you might first need to learn about the types of search functions available or what county your ancestor lived. If you are trying to locate the parents of a child, you may need to research the types of records available in the town the child was born or seek the records that person created. Of course, improving your research skills is a combination of many small goals before you can achieve the final goal of locating your brick wall ancestor.

This class is limited to eight people per class and is for those who have researched their genealogy at least one year. Please sign up in advance. There is no charge. When you register, an application will be emailed to you in advance that must be completed and returned before the class starts. This is a hands-on class. It will teach research methodology using genealogy materials at the Main Library in Vero Beach. You will do the research. It will not be done for you.

The same one-time class will be repeated **every Wednesday 10 AM until Noon for July and August**. All classes will be in the genealogy department on the second floor of the Main Library.
